It is our great privilege and honor to celebrate with you for our success in year 2022 that 1,598 high students including 938 girls graduated from IT literacy, Soft-Life Skills and Business Course from the five high schools in the five different provinces that we partnered with.

In addition, 202 students including 111 girls impacted from our English and Computer classes in graveyard, slum and rural community. The students were very pleased to come and learn as they did not only receive the knowledge and skills, but also the values of Christian living and they got additional support during their involvement within the program.

Above all, 43 families were excited with their direct water supply connection to their households so that they could save much money to improve the wellbeing of the children rather than high cost from the private connection in the community. As well, the new house buildings were supported to the two families and four small business and education loan given to the families in graveyard.

Furthermore, we would give our high values to the good cooperation and collaboration from the government stakeholders, especially the local authorities, Department of Education, School Principals and Teachers who actively involved with the program for the benefit of the students. We would also appreciate for the positive feedback from the schools for us to invest more computers.

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## 1-EDUCATION SUPPORT

**Goal:** To increase the access of children to their primary and secondary education leading to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university.



### I-Graveyard, Slum, Urban and Rural Community:

To see the children and adults in cemetery, slum and rural communities acquire the proficient knowledge and skills of English and IT literacy with quality and strong values in their lives.

#### 1. Child Right Promotion

Every child was required to complete their enrolment form which child protection information embedded with the internal regulation.

The child protection information embedded with the internal regulation was read and explained in the classes with the participation and questions to clarify by the students and teachers.

Every visitor was asked to sign the code of conduct of child protection and Prevention of Sexual Exploitation Abuse and Harassment Policy ready before they were allowed to visit the county.



#### 2. Child Education

202 students including 111 girls received their English, Computer and Preschool at the project centres in graveyard, slum in Phnom Penh and rural community in Preah Vihear.

Project centres and schools were opened on Monday to Friday where they could learn the four macro skills with weekly and monthly test and every student had to take

their final test for the books so that they could know their capacity. Even it is the non-formal education for all levels of English and Computer classes and Preschool, but the teachers had to produce the monthly results based on the designed Student Record Booklet.

I am **Liza** when I came to English class at the first time,



I tried my best to study. For me, my English class is so important it is one of the subjects that you and I have to learn because it will help us in the future. I am going to tell you about what I have been through English Class. For a year by, I can understand and know the way to use it in the correct way that I have never known before. The result I noted I got the better score in the class. I want also to tell you back before I came to Bethel Mission that I could say I had nothing to understand about English. I would like to thank teacher Arun and Bethel Mission for spending both money and true heart to help me and my community from the beginning until I can graduate level 3 today. After finishing it, it is not the end for me. I promise I will try more for the next level and I will use what I have learned to help one another to improve my society. Thank you.



The parents much appreciated to the quality of education that the project provided. They told that they had to spend much money for their children, but they did not since the project started. The project helped reduce their expenses in the families and risk for the children to leave home afar, especially in the evening.



The children were pleased and enjoyed over their classes. Everyone worked hard with their good confidence and participation. They loved their teachers and appreciated for the commitment to teach even rainy season and some disobedience.



Additionally, 30 students, 23 girls, at the project centre, they actively participated in their preschool activities. Currently, they were able to write both Khmer and English better. Preschool is the good bridge for them to enrol in the primary school of the government and also for the additional support back to boost their study.



Furthermore, 46 students joined IT literacy classes in graveyard and slum. Each student appreciated their teachers and Bethel Mission who always does the good investment to their future. During and after the pandemics, our citizens in the country are aware of the importance of Technology, computer skill. It is also very vital for the student to learn online and do the research not only for their study, but also their future career development.



Bethel Mission develop 8 modules for the students starting from Introduction of Computer, Typing Khmer-English, MS Work 2016, MS PowerPoint 2016, MS Excel 2016, How to use Internet and Email, Networking

and Maintenance of Computer. All students are from English classes selected by their ages and grade to fill with.



I am **Sonan**. I did not know anything about computer even computer parts or typing such as English and



Khmer. After I have a chance to join the class I start to learn about the introduction to computer and typing. I also know about computer parts,

how to turn on/off and Microsoft Word.

When I am learning computer for the first lesson, I feel it's difficult to watch the screen and using any software. Moreover, it's time to study typing Khmer and English I try my best, but it's not good at that time. I feel that why it's so hard. I realize that because it is my first time to touch computer. However, after 4 months I know that my typing skill is better than the starter for both Khmer and English. I also know more about computer software. I want to tell that studying computer is necessary for our daily life. If you have a chance to study, do not miss it. It will make us to have a bright future to have a good life. I am delighted to receive the free study of English and Computer with Bethel Mission.



I am **Panha**, 9 years old. I study in grade 3. In the future, I want to be a doctor because my father would like me to help people and I like it too. I knew Bethel Mission from my mother's friend. I wanted to learn typing so much, but I couldn't find any school in my place. So when my



mother asked me to study at Bethel Mission I am excited to come. My English was terrible before I came to Bethel Mission and it is also new for me about computer. When I started the computer class I learned a lot of putting finger on keyboard and know the basic of using computer. Soon, my siblings came to study Bethel Mission. It is hard to find any school like Bethel Mission that have both English with Computer classes to learn. Thanks for Bethel Mission for giving me an opportunity to study there.



### Construction Slum:

More than 100 families from the different parts of the country lived and worked and the construction workers within Phnom Penh where the company dedicated the land for them to build the huts to stay.



The children are able to access school as they have to go to the construction site with their parents early in the morning and came back to the huts after 5 pm.



After the need assessment to more than 30 households with the Construction Site Slum, Bethel Mission is the one NGO who is dedicated to set up one hut among the people and works to provide education program, health and bible study to the children and their parents. The education program starts at 5:30 pm after the children safely arrive home from the construction work with their parents. More than 30 children joined the program.

The children were excited for the Khmer and English classes they have.



Preah Vihear, the rural community, is more than 300 Km away from Phnom Penh where the development is slow comparing to other provinces in the country. Bethel Mission Organization School is the one Christian school in the town set up in late December 2022 to provide education and spiritual program to reach out the children.



More than 80 children come and learn their English from Monday to Friday taught by the local teachers.



## II- High School Intervention:

To improve Cambodia youth's capacity and provide them with opportunity to develop their potential in education and employment.

After the recovery from the pandemics, the Digital Practice plays a very important role in helping Cambodia to restore the growth of the county, especially the education sectors including the government and private institutions. It was a fast running for the people to catch up with the digital era. This gave a quick boost to Industry 4.0 where the Royal Government of Cambodia targeted. It was observed that the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports (MOEYS) launched the E-Learning App from the city to the rural communities. The education system was dramatically changed from handwriting to computing and online working.

Bethel Mission partnered with Investment for Life (IFL), Netherlands to work with five high schools in different five provinces and graduated 1,598 high school students including 938 girls passed their training within their individual schools including IT Literacy, Soft-Life Skills and Business Course training.



Above all, the principal received appreciation from the university that their students seemed to grow in knowledge and skills in term of IT Literacy and Soft-Life Skills at the university level. **Mr. Bros**, the principal told them that “It is because my school partnered with IFL project.”

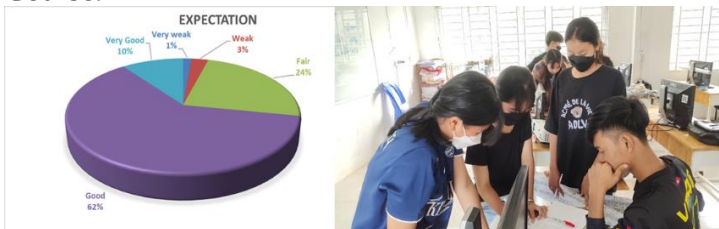


According to the graduation analysis below showed that, there were 1,598 students including 938 girls passed the final exam and received the certificates from the schools including 989 students got one certificate, 548 girls, 490 students with two certificates, 303 girls and 119 students received three certificates, 87 girls.

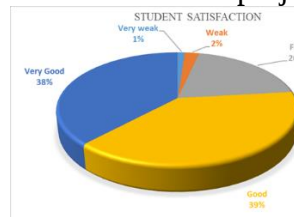
Additionally, 96% of the students confirmed that the training is very useful in their daily work and life living

the era of the Industrial Revolution 4.0 and the digital economy. It met their expectation.



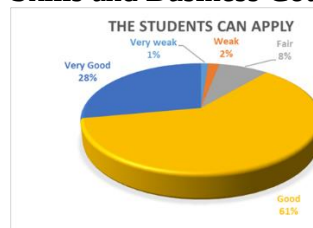

The below graph showed that 97% of the students were satisfied with the project training courses.



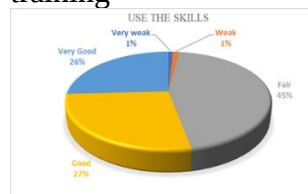

Thanks to Donor and Bethel Mission for provide a new Business Skill Course as well.”

According to the learning evaluation, 97% of the students were able to apply what they learned from the teachers and trainers including IT Literacy, Soft and Life Skills and Business Course.



**Phannit**, 18 years old, the boy student from Sampov Poun high school said “Business Course made me think about more idea and push me to run a restaurant soon. I love cooking. This course opens up my own opportunity how I can be a business owner in the future. I love presentation skill. It makes me more confident when I shared my topic to everyone in the training.”

Through the monitoring and follow up to the teaching and learning, the result showed that 98% of the students were able to use the knowledge and skills after their training



**Srey Neat**, 17 years old, girl student, at Slaku high school, presented her exercise group assignment for the Business course. She was very shy for the presentation because it was the first time for her in leading the group. She said “I am still happy after completing her group work presentation. She proudly said “I would like to thank teacher **Bunlai** and my classmates for providing me the opportunity to get the new experience in leading group and presentation.”

## 2-HEALTH PROMOTION

To promote the healthy well-beings of the children and their families to access clean water, good hygiene and sanitation, better nutrition and safe shelters.

### Graveyard:

#### 1- Water Filtration System:

155 families in graveyard impacting from the installed Water Filtration System with R.O, UV system and high pH tested. Project maintained the service of water filtration system so that more than 150 families benefited. With the quality of drinking water, they offered to pay for their refilling to bottles. The project could run with the contribution when changing the filters as needed. The families gave high values to the quality and the taste of water as they explained that they felt safe and healthy after they drank the water. More than ten families came and made the refilling their drinking water. The project helped the community gained time and save the money.



#### 2- Water Supply Connection:

The project also facilitated to have the direct water supply connection from the government to 43 families so that they could save from \$0.62 to \$0.19 per cubic meter. As the results, 43 families including 37 men, 46 women, 39 boys and 68 girls received the direct water connection from the water supply of the government. In addition, the project built two houses for the families in graveyards.



### 3- Safe Shelter:

**Mrs. Dany** with one single daughter, the widow, has lived within the cemetery for more than 10 years without any household, but shared the roof and bed with the relative and neighbour. However, her situation was excitedly changed with the new house.



As well, **Mrs. Channoern** was also accused of the fire-lighter, lived within the tent and was discriminated by the community because of the accusation. However, She



worked with the village leader and the commune chief to get the letter of authorization for the building in order to protect from the harm of her accusers within the community of the graveyard.

Channoern and her husband worked hard after receive the business loan to save the money for her new house rebuilding.

They were responsible for the contribution of the building even the support from the partner of Bethel Mission.

With the intervention from Bethel Mission, she and her family selected the constructor before the construction started. Blessedly, Channoern and her family received the new house in November 2022.

They were very excited to get the house back from the fire, even bigger and stronger than the burned down one.

#### 4- Eye Test and Glass Cutting:

Bethel Mission partnered with the Grace Eyes to help 40 caregivers including 29 women in graveyard to have their eyes tested and cut eyeglass.



#### 5- Nutrition:

Bethel Mission received the support of bread and cake from Tours Les Jour Bakery Company and distributed to hundreds of the children and their families within the graveyard, slum and rural communities.



#### 6- Clothes Distribution:

Partnered with friends of Christians and non-Christians, Bethel Mission collected clothes and other unused stuff to redonate the children and their families within the graveyard, slum and rural communities.



### 3-LIVELIHOOD BUILDING

To improve the livelihood of the families and communities with sustainable income generation to support their children wellbeing.

There are 4 families in graveyard and slum received the business and education loan from Bethel Mission to generate income and support their families.

Mrs. **Channoern** with her husband and five children received the loan for her small business setup so that she could survive with the income after her house was on fire

in 2021. She was not only able to pay back the loan by months, but also save for her future needs.

She told that “I can earn the profit from \$20-30 per day. I will save and add more business location so that I and my children can shift with my husband.”



### 4-SPIRITUAL NURTURE AND FORMATION

To see the children and their families grow socially and spiritually with love, joy and peace.



It is the platform where the children can come and have fun activities and learn the values of lives. It is normally open on Sundays, but also on the weekday during the classes as well, for the children and parents to learn about



love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control in their life journey.

Bethel Mission believes that Transformation is from inside out, that is through and from the words of God. When Heart chaged Life changed.

#### Children's Day

More than 50 children joined the celebration of the Children's Day at the graveyard. Mr. **Khiev Chuong**, the village leader said “Only Bethel Mission can live among us and always celebrate for us. I could thank everyone to

come and value the Children's Day for our children in graveyard." They were excited and had fun with gifts, lucky draw and fellowship during the events.



### Sunday School

Nearly 100 children and adults come to Sunday School weekly to have fun, worship and Bible study.



### Worship:

The children and adults enjoyed their songs of praise both on Sundays and during the classes of their English and Preschool.



### Bible study:

Both the children and adults learned about the Sin and Eternity and the 9 fruits of love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

261 children and adults in the graveyard, slum and rural communities joined to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ in December 2022.

The celebration participated by the village management and representatives from commune office.

I also learned about Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) of the private sectors. I am interested in a detailed fundraising plan for a project, an action plan for organizing an event and to create good oral, written and visual presentations.

Hello, my name is **Raksmei** living in graveyard. I am 11 years old and I am in grade 5.

I remember before entering Bethel Mission I could not read at all and did not understand the meaning, especially the grammar, I did not know how to use it.

But when Bethel Mission started the English class, I enrolled, and that was when I learned and understood more than I expected, now I can read, spell, and understand sentences.



In the future, I want to be a teacher because I want to transform and be a role model for my community as well. I am so thankful to Teacher Nita for teaching me and thanks to the Bethel Mission for making this class

happen, and finally thank you to the donors who supported my class.



My name is **Channita** and I am 24 years old. I am an English teacher at Bethel Mission in the slums since the beginning of 2021. I used to be a teacher of English at the private schools, but on my first day at Bethel Mission, I saw a lot of kids who were very different from the kids I used to teach in a private school. Both in words, in

dress, and in knowledge. The first day I had a hard time because I just got to know them, they did not listen and well behave, they talk in class, sometimes they argued in class and they still did not write clearly. However, I had a feeling that this was what I wanted to do and changed them. I continue to this day. After teaching them for a while, I noticed that they made a lot of progress, they understood, they could read, they could write, they could teach each other.

Meanwhile, due to Pandemic of Covid-19, some students dropped out of school because they did not have the equipment, as well as phones or computers. But I also



see that some parents they give their phones to their children for study, and their children also share to those who do not have the phone. They are study two or three people per phone. So I see that they know how to share with each other.



And it gave me more motivation to teach them more, and I will try to find ways to teach them more and more because in the future I want to see them become people who can change both life and knowledge in their community.

And I do not only want to teach in their communities, I want to teach in other areas like them as well as in the

provinces. And finally, I would like to thank Bethel Mission for providing me with the classes, giving me the opportunity to contribute by teaching them, and thanks to the donors who supported the classes.



**Sievmey** (the presenter), 18, the youngest child in her family. She is a student at Borivas high school. Her mother is a businesswoman and her father is a policeman. Sievmey's mother is a seafood seller on the beach, But Sievmey and her father are at home because her siblings are married and left the family.

Sievmey completed soft-life skills, computer skills and business skills. She said that “I was really happy to learn all these skills. I know that life with good computer skills and Business skills is really important at the present time, but I didn't have the opportunity to learn the courses because our school does not have any such skills for students.



I am very excited to hear that BMO and IFL came into my school to help the students with these skills. As soon as the setup finished, we entered the class and I gained the skills as well as lots of other students. I used computer skills in studying, especially for presentation. In addition, I am received the Business Course from Teacher Bunlai as well. After the course, my imagine is that I want to be a businesswoman like my mother. I would like to thank and wish all the best for the kind support and contribution to invest for a better future for us.

Each family was responsible for the last connection from the water meter installed by the government. They requested and received the free materials for the work.



After their English class, the students are able to take their turn and learned their IT literacy so that they can build up their bridge of life to their future career and success.



**Raksmei** told that “I am delighted and thankful for the opportunity to learn both English and Computer at Bethel Mission for free. It is hard for my family to afford to learn outside as it is very expensive to pay for the study and certificate. It is free at Bethel Mission. Thank you.

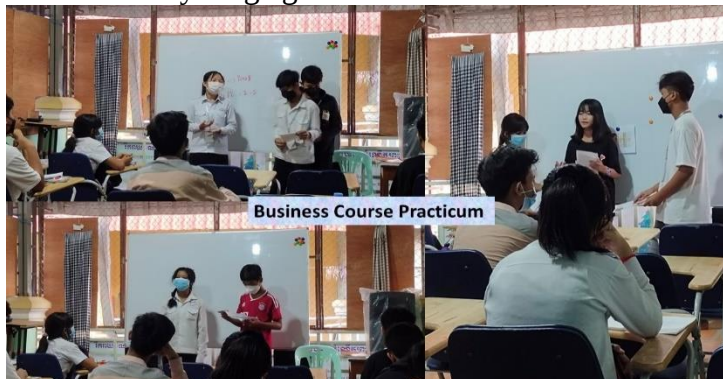
