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“I love my teacher because when I do not understand the lesson, she explains me until I get it. Additionally, in my English class has included with the Bible. I was changed because I always liked to talk a lot in the class, said a bad words and I did not respect the older. However, after I engaged to the Bible study it has changed my life. I would like to thank my teacher and Bethel Mission for coming to help my community and give us the free classes of Khmer study, English and Computer to the children in the graveyard and slum communities.”





Dear Supporting Partners and Friends,

We would like to invite you to celebrate the key accomplishments succeeded within the year 2023 even the challenges came along as you played an important role to transform the lives of the people living in the graveyard, the slum, the urban, the poor rural communities and in prisons.

With your involvement, praying and support, we brought the lasting changing lives of the people within the above-mentioned areas through the Education, Health, Livelihood Building, Church Engagement and Resiliency of Spirit and In-Prison project interventions.

Noticeably, 333 children including 187 girls enrolled and studied their English and Computer classes and more than 200 of them passed their final test and received the certificates for the year. The children we were able to learn the values of life, love and hope for their behavior change. The majority of the parents appreciated when they sent their children to Bethel Mission as they could see the good fruits in their children's lives after their participation. Amongst, 30% of the children took part in their Sunday School.

With the financial support from IFL project, Wilde Ganzen and DE HEUS TMH CO., LTD, Bethel Mission worked with nine high schools in eight provinces to provide IT literacy, Soft-Lif skills and Business course. 2,328 high school students, 1,345 girls passed the final test and certified from the schools, according the graduation report from the teachers and the principals. The project conducted 87 visits to the schools to assess, monitor and follow up with the teachers and follow up, coaching, ToT and graduation. The school management and the department of education appreciated the project and the students were excited and satisfied with their learnings.

We give our high value to the Bluefield for helping to initiate the Business Course and more advanced courses for the high schools and CDC so that the students acquire more knowledge and skills beyond what they learned from schools. By seeing the needs, the project initiated the Career Development Centre (CDC) in February 2023 in order to provide the students with the shared housing, boost training and part-time job or internship when they come to Phnom Penh. To promote CDC, the project team conducted 48 parent engagement meetings to 38 villages with the participation from 461 caregivers, 241 women and 463 students, 239 girls. We do hope the students will enroll at CDC in 2024.

In addition, Bethel Mission partnered with the People for Medical Cooperation International (PMCI) to conduct the Mobile Clinic for the free health check and treatment to 537 patients including 162 men and 375 women at the Bethel Mission School-Preah Vihear. The event was strongly support from the provincial administration, department of health and the relevant local authorities. The patients came from not only in the district, but other districts around the province.

Furthermore, Bethel Mission partnered with the Ministry of Interior and Provincial Prison to help the more than 100 prisoners with food pack including noodle, canned fish, fish and soy sauces in Kampong Chhnang prison with under the financial support from Bayside Church. The prisoners were excited to receive the words of encouragement from Her Excellency Sok Sambath, the under-secretary of state of the Ministry of Interior and Bayside Church.

Spiritually, more than 200 children and their families joined and celebrated Christmas and more than 200 children receive gift boxes through the gospel presentation and passed the discipleship classes. Moreover, more than 500 students were preached about the gospel of salvation and majority accepted.

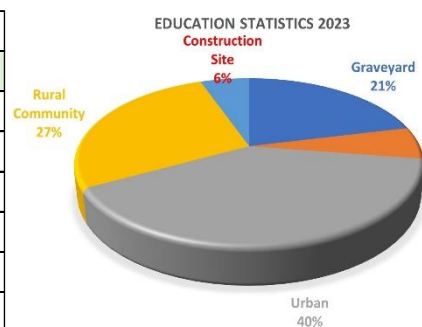
1 Education Promotion

To increase the access of children to their primary and secondary education leading to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university.

1- Ministry Education

Bethel Mission Organization (BMO) is providing Education to the different groups of the children in the various locations within Cambodia in the spirit of “Promote Education Transform Life” as it is the Light of Life and the most Powerful Weapon which they can use to change their world. In addition to this, the extracurricular programs including Preschool, Khmer Boost, Computer and English to the children in the graveyard, the slum, the construction site, the urban and the rural communities so that they are able to build up their extra basic knowledge, skills and behaviors.

Graveyard Community: It is the history of the people started to migrate and lived within the graveyard back in 1985 where the riverbank erosion in Tonle Basac river caused thousands of households collapsed into the river. Even living among the tombs is not legal. They have no choice, but to live more decades hoping to have a good promised land. Originally, more than 300 tombs were buried. Currently 127 families with 400 people plus live in the graveyard where limited to hygiene, sanitation and nutrition.

The majority of the parents is illiterate and less values to the education of their children and the drop rate is high, for they have to work for their materialism, alcoholic, gambling and drugs. One of the investments that Bethel Mission is helping these people for the life change is Education at it is the passport to the future of the individual children.



1- Graveyard Preschool

There are 31 children including 24 girls coming to their regular preschool. The children aged 4-8 years old can access to their kindergarten lessons including the basic knowledge of Khmer and English; spelling, reading, writing and singing and support them with a good hygiene and nutrition. It is a bridge building and connection to their government school.

The students are able to read and write in Khmer, English and to sing in both learnings. The parents are satisfied with the growth in knowledge, skills and the behaviors of their children and they appreciated Bethel Mission for helping their children.



2- Graveyard English and Computer class

With the support from Bethel Mission, the children can have a good access to their education and job with the good knowledge and skills of the English and Computer literacy. More than 50 children in the graveyard are able to improve their four-macro skills of the English literacy including reading, writing, listening and speaking their English and apply their computer skills for their further and higher education and careers.



Slum Project

It is where more than 50 poor families come and live in the Buddhist Temple and along the roadside. Owing to their living standard, the families could not afford to the fee-paying at the private schools.

17 children, including 8 girls joined the free classes of English and Computer classes. Currently, they are able to read, write, listen and speak their English and apply their computer knowledge and skills at home and school and some children shared what they learned to their friends.



Construction Site Support

The place where people came from the different parts of Cambodia to do the construction work. There are more than 100 families living in the site where the construction company gives the free space, electricity and water so that they can work for the company.



The challenges for them are hygiene, sanitation, nutrition, protection and education, for the children who come along and live in the construction site. The children do not go to school and they have to go with their parents to work early in the morning. After meeting with the parents, Bethel Mission set up the education program where the children and the young teenagers can study Khmer after 5 pm. Currently, more than 15 children, 7 girls come to study regularly. They are able to draw, spell, read and write Khmer. Beyond the class, they can learn the values of lives at weekend.



Urban Project

Even the tall buildings growing in the city and capital, but there are many poor families living on the sewage and destitute locations to survive.



More than 100 children, 62 girls came to access their English and Computer classes in order to back up their study and future employment. Both the children and parents are satisfied and happy to send their children as they receive more than the knowledge and skills, but also the values of lives.

Rural Education Project

Preah Vihear is located north of Cambodia, more than 300 km away from Phnom Penh and 6 hours to drive where it is limited for the English and Computer literacy. It is expensive to learn with the private schools. Bethel Mission started the education program in 2022 with the purpose of providing the extracurricular of the knowledge and skills of the English and Computer literacy and the values of lives.



Currently, there are more than 100 children, 60 girls receiving the teaching. Both the parents and the children are more excited for the education as the children acquired more than English and Computer literacy, but the learned the good values of love and hope. In addition, the children got the nutrition feeding, notebooks, schoolbags and clothes.



Khmer Boost

It is a boost classes so that the students came to learn supplementary lessons or extracurricular over their schools. The students always upgrade at schools, but the quality of their education is limited comparing to their grade as the teachers are not able to take a good care of each student owing to the crowded number of the students in the classes. This will help reduce the drop and repeated rates of the students. 18 students, 12 girls enrolled in the Khmer Boost classes.

Mrs. Lyhour, the mother of Seiha told Mrs. Sinuon, the Operations Director that “My son changed after learning with Bethel Mission for a couple of months. His English and Khmer are better and especially he helps me with the work.”



Annual Graduation

More 200 children finished and passed their final exam of the year 2023 and received the certificates based on the general marking system. It was the first time for the students to graduate and certify. The students were excited. Manit, the boy student, told “I am very pleased to hear that I could pass the final test and will receive the certificate.”



The students invited their parents to join the Graduation Ceremony and everyone enjoyed to celebrate their results of the year. Mr. Dara, the representative of the parents in the event, impressed that “I am happy to see my children graduate and get the certificates today. It is my first time to speak to many people. I would like to thank Bethel Mission for the celebration.”



Mr. Koy, the blacksmith, the father and Mrs. Bopha, the housewife; the parents of Liza, the student expressed excitement to see their daughter passed the final test 2023 and certified.

Chakriya, the student, said “I am happy that parents and sisters came and congratulate my graduation today. Thank for helping me.”



2- High School Project, Investment For Life (IFL)

Even the Rectangular ended, the new Pentagonal Strategy-Phase 1 of the Royal Kingdom of Cambodia defined the growth of the country by setting forth the one of the priorities, the Human Capital Development as Priority#1 focusing on the Technical Skills Training and the Enhancement of Quality of Education and Technology.

The Royal Government of Cambodia laid out a comprehensive digital strategy plan for the period of 2023-2027 which aims to strengthen work efficiency, improve public service delivery, and enhance national security and transparency through digital technology in the 4.0 industrial revolution. Department of International Relations Institute emphasized the importance of digital utilization in various sectors and said that it was the most essential and appropriate as the world is actively utilizing digital in administrative works, business, finance, governance and others sectors.



In responses to Digital Strategy Plan, Bethel Mission works in partnership with 9 high schools in 8 different provinces to provide IT literacy, Soft-Life skills and Business courses.

91% students claimed that the trainings met their expectation and 96% told that the courses were very useful for their higher education and employment and 97% of the students were satisfied with the training.

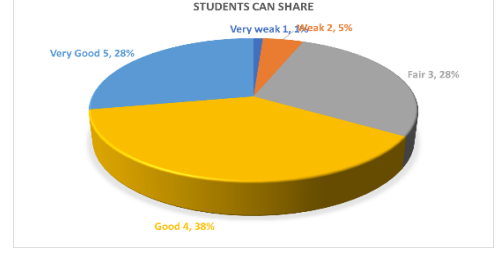
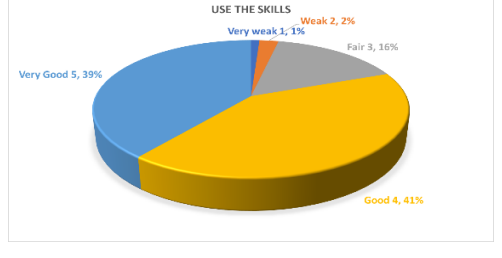
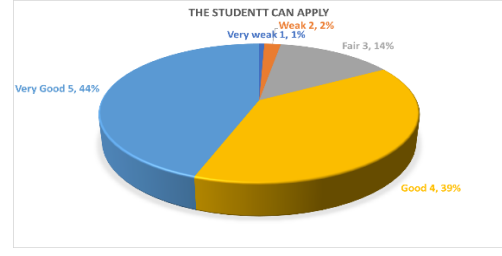
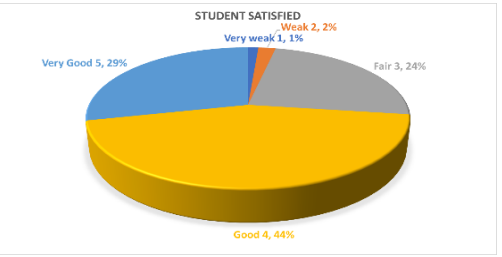
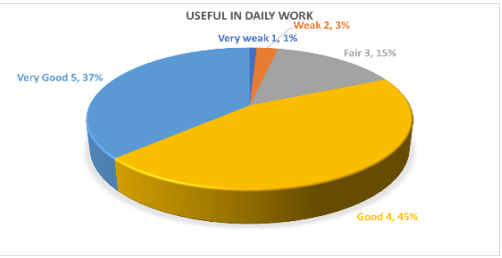
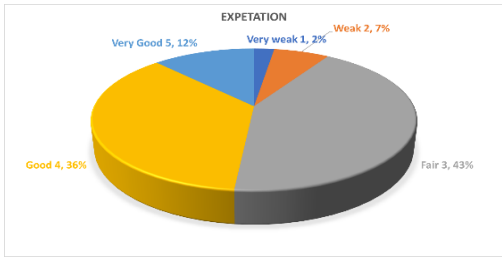
that 97% of the students were able to apply and use the skills after their training. However, 94% of the students could share their knowledge to other students and friends.

Kosal, boy, 18, said “I do not have confidence in myself, do not value and do not dare to give myself the opportunity. I have negative thoughts in my mind and always have a vague idea to set goals. But since I attended Soft and Life Skills, I am very satisfied with the course. I have noticed that I have developed my knowledge. I know how to set goal for life and find the strengths and weaknesses. I loved the lesson very much as it helped me to understand how to make decision and how to treat people positively. I would thank my teacher and Bethel Mission for the kind support.”



Mr. Kimhach, the deputy Director of the Department of Education stressed his speech during the graduation ceremony that “There are twenty-six high schools within the province of Kampong Speu, Borset is the first school

who received the full support from Bethel Mission including training and graduation. I am so grateful for the strong support since the start. I do hope the project will continue to help in the future. Thank you.”



Mr. Sethy, the Director of the Provincial Department of Education (DoE) at Prey Veng said during the official meeting between the DoE, the school and Bethel Mission that “The government plans to have computer classes for every school across the country, but the resources are very limited to fund. However, the contribution and support from the NGOs are vital to push the implementation to the strategy and goal of the country, especially the Ministry of Education. Furthermore, Bethel Mission contributes to the great need and impact of the students. I would give a very high value for the support from Bethel Mission to more than 600 students in Kampong Leav High School, Prey Veng from the last three years, 2021-2023. I myself and on behalf of the provincial DoE, do hope that Bethel Mission will continue to support other schools in Prey Veng and other provinces.”

Kimhor, boy, 17, in grade 11, told “I can use the computer including typing faster and make a lot of lists better. I will use this knowledge and skills for my future career working in a company or any institutes related to IT skills. I can apply this knowledge I learned from my teacher without asking others. I will try to learn more about IT literacy. I hope I can make charts. I think I will use this knowledge and life skills to help my community work. I would like to thank my teacher and IFL project who support my friend and I for IT class.”

Pisey, girl, 17, in grade 11, Borset high school, said “I want to tell you that what I learned changed my mind through this program. I knew what strength and weakness about me. I have learnt the setting of Goal and Expectation. I have never had it, but after this course I could set my goal. I understand how I look to the weak person differently than before and I can help them especially people that close to me. I do hope that I will keep it to use for my future when I go out to the new world and to study at Phnom Penh.”

Mr. Sorya is a teacher of computer at Slaku high school. He is very worried about the problem of installing windows, which is always broken, always updated and always requires a license. Our project team helps him on how to install windows, especially the internals inside the computer. He learned to use it and said “Nowadays, I have a lot of control over my teaching and computer maintenance. I am thankful for the IFL project, which helps to reach computer classes for students. I am proud of my students who well graduated.

The hygiene, sanitation and nutrition for the children and their families live in the graveyard, the construction site, the urban and the rural communities are limited to the normal living standard of the country, especially after the pandemics. The adults have to go and work in the city and sell their labour out of the country in order to meet the need of their families.

Nutrition:



Bethel Mission worked with the generous individuals to support more than 200 hundred people in the province of Prey Veng including the children their families where each family received rice, fish sauce, soy sauce, noodle, sampot, scarf and bread.



Above all, Bethel Mission received the support of bread and cake from the Bakery's to feed the hundred of the children and their families in in the graveyard, the construction site, the urban and the rural communities. Kimheng, the representative to the children told that "The bread and cake are delicious, I saw at the Supermarket and it is expensive that I could not able to afford. However, I have it today."



More than 70 children in Bethel Mission School-Preah Vihear told their teachers that they have never had such a great taste of bread and cake in their province. **Chanry**, the student representative, told "I sometime do birthday at home with my family, but the cake was not tasty as my friends and I always ate at Bethel Mission School. I would like to thank Teacher Sinuon for bring the cake and bread to us."

Eye Care:

Most families do not take a good care of the eyes of the children when they can see, especially the poor families. However, the Optical expert said that parent and adult must have their eyes checked to avoid the vision implication or they have to spend much money to restore or sometime it cannot be done. Bethel Mission partnered with the **Thrive** and **Srun Heng Optics** to help more than 30 children to have their eyes tested, checked and received the free eyeglasses. This is a generous support and an important help to the families that could not afford



Safe Environment:

In order to promote the cleaning, the plastic and rubbish management of the community, Bethel Mission promoted the **Safe Environment** so that children and adults could join together to manage the plastic and rubbish. They are able to place the waste into the dustbin and other containers as the dump truck come to collect regularly.



Sanitation:



The latrine was built to help the preschool children and the teacher at the graveyard to promote their hygiene and sanitation during the teaching, learning and work.

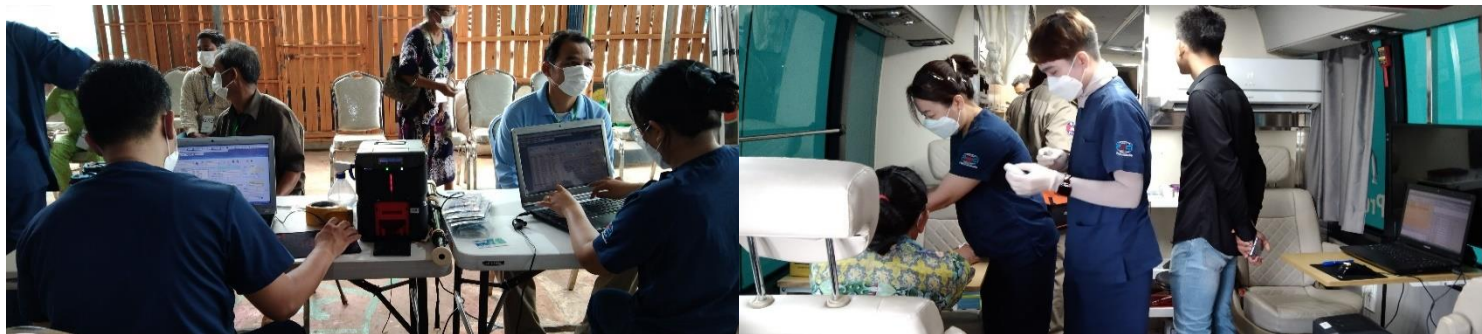
number of the students who used to spend long time to their bathroom at home and sometime, they played and were late for the classes after their break. It also helps the children to clean their hand before eating and their class to start.

Clothes Distribution:

It has been more than 20 years that the Unused Stuff Collection started. Especially clothes were collected and distributed to hundreds of children and families in the targets where Bethel Mission works, both in Phnom Penh and the provinces around the country.



The Mobile Clinic:



Bethel Mission partnered with People for Medical Cooperation International (PMCI) to conduct the Mobile Clinic at the Bethel Mission School-Preah Vihear to 537 patients including 162 men and 375 women among 12 old-aging patients received the crutches.

There were more than 40 doctors and nurses led by the Korean missionary couple worked tirelessly to conduct health check and treatment according to their professionalism with the good virtue and high moral. Every one celebrated the accomplishment for their mission of helping the people by showing the great love of the Lord Jesus Christ.



The Mobile Clinic was conducted only two days; however, many more people missed the health check and treatment. We do hope MPCII will come again next year so that more people will be impacted.





③ Income Generation Self-Sufficient Project

To improve the livelihood of the families and communities with sustainable income generation to support their children well-being.

The Sustainability is to make the families where serve become self-reliant. This will help our beneficiaries live on their own income generation and be self-sufficient. Bethel Mission support the families to set and start up their small business from what they could think and do based on their talent to earn a living, especially they are able to provide a self-support to their families.



Mrs. Channoern received the income generation support from Bethel Mission to set up her business. She increased the business scale up to two mobile business carts. Her husband and daughter are actively involved the business. She is able to return \$15 a day to deduct her capital investment loan. Blessedly, she and her family could afford to have brand-new motor loan. She said “I am happy that Bethel Mission supported me.”

Being as the mother and father to raise five children, **Mrs. Pok** is struggle for her handicraft. Sadly, her husband has been in prison for nearly ten years owing to the rape case of the young child within her community.

Bethel Mission supported her the materials so that she could produce the different kinds of animal including the turtle, deer, parrot and so on. Her young daughter is in the free Preschool and two more daughters in English and Computer classes of Bethel Mission. **Mrs. Pok** always encourages her children to keep on studying. She is faithful to her faith. She is one of the strong Christians in her community.



Mr. Thet and his wife have one son and three daughters received the free English and Computer classes at Bethel Mission. Even they are the scavengers, but they inspired their children to keep studying hard at school. With the scavenging, they could afford to loan a scooter for their children to school. **Mr. Thet** saved and return \$5-\$10 a month. He told that “I have never had any scooter in my life. However, I would like to thank

Bethel Mission for helping to get it. It is important for me and my family to have it or we have to spend much money for motor taxi and it is hard to ride the bicycle. As my son is always sick, so it is a good transportation for me both day and night to bring him to see the doctors.”

Mr. Channa was born and lived in the graveyard more than 30 years. She has children and greatgrandchildren. After the pandemics, she struggled to feed the children as her husband could not afford to work as the construction constructor. However, she got the business loan and make her own local and traditional cakes so that she is able to get income to help the family.





④ Church Engagement and Resiliency of Spirit

1-Church Engagement: To equip local church pastors and leaders to make their churches become a place where hurting people to find healing and receive social and spiritual support.



The local churches must be the salt and light within the community where they are able to shine **Jesus**'s love to the people around. As **Jesus** said in Matthew 16:18 "I will build my church" and He commanded His followers in Matthew 28:19-20 "¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age." The capacity building of the local church is the goal for Bethel Mission because it believes that when the local churches are strong, then they are able to make the positive changes to the lives of their community people.



Mr. Sirivuth went the bus and met a Muslim man. After they discussed about their individual faith and Muslim man said "As Muslim and Christian, we are brothers and sisters from the same Abraham, the forefather." This is to align with the identity of Bethel Mission of the Christian and non-governmental organization of non-profit dedicated to promoting and improving the livelihood and wellbeing of the people to show the Christ's love regardless of race, color, gender, religion, and political tendency. Bethel Mission built a good relationship with the imams and brought 110 gift boxes to bless the children of Muslim. It was the great opportunity to have the gospel presentation. This is to contribute the Royal Government's Religious Hominization in Cambodia.



Bethel Mission equipped the team members of the women group to do the outreach activity to local churches and the construction where the people are poorer than where they live. Even they are not rich, they share what they have to demonstrate God's love as John 13:34-35 "³⁴ A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."



Bethel Mission supported local churches with Education program including English and Computer classes so that the community children are able to learn additional knowledge, skills and the values of life at the churches. **Mr. Tith**, the pastor said “It is important for Bethel Mission to help and the children come to church, not only for the English and Computer classes, but also worship and Bible study.”

2-Resiliency of Spirit- To teach and preach the gospels of the God our Lord Jesus Christ and make the disciples across the nations.



Beyond helping the local churches, Worshiping, Preaching and Teaching the Bible are mandatory for Bethel Mission in order to respond to the Life Transformation of its Vision. It is not enough to provide the knowledge and skills to the children, but the values of life; the virtue and moral, love and hope are the most important. **Mr. Sirivuth** said “Transformation must be born inside out. No one can change Life except the one who give life, the Life Giver, the Lord Jesus Christ. We need to give them the truth that can set the people free from the bondage of all kind of sins.”



Sunday School and Weekly Bible Study:

The children and their families are able to join the Resiliency of Spirit program at Sund School and Weekly Bible Study at their individual locations, the Graveyard, the Slum, the Construction Site, the Urban and the Rural community on Sunday and in their classroom once a week. The program is to help the students to know the Truth, Worship and tell other what they learned so that they can invite their friends in.





The program is beyond the spiritual base, but help the children to be more active and courageous. They can use their talent and practice reading skill. In addition, they can receive some more support from Bethel Mission.



Women’s Day:

Theme: Women are the characters of peace where Bethel Mission found in the Bible. After God created Man, He made Woman to be a help of the man_ Genesis 2:18, 21 & 22. The help is not weak or cannot help. Women are playing a big part of their community, country and world.

Bethel Mission promoted the role of Woman is equal to Man. Woman receives what Man does, leading, managing, worship the real true God and do the evangelism work for Him. Woman helps Man and vice versa.



Mrs. Sinuon prayed for Women “I pray that God continue to use Woman for the source of Peace in the world As women we should have joy as God made us as His child, John 1:12. The power to bear children, to prepare household and help the man. God is happy for Women to read His Bible, Worship Him, Pray to Him and Do evangelism for Him. Amen”



Easter, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ:

As Christians, we believe in the Bible, the words of God, the Lord Jesus Christ. Based on Matthew 28:5-6 “He is Risen”. Easter, principal festival of the Christian church, which celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his Crucifixion. Easter takes place three days after Jesus's death on Good Friday. After Jesus was crucified on the Friday his body was taken down from the cross and buried in a cave tomb. The tomb was guarded by Roman soldiers and an enormous stone was put over the entrance. On Sunday Mary Magdalene and some of Jesus's disciples visited the tomb.



Christmas Celebration:

Christmas is celebrated to commemorate of the Birth of Jesus Christ. It is a time for Christians worldwide to reflect on the significance of Jesus' birth and the message of love and salvation he brought as in John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."



There were more than 200 children and families joining the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ 2023 at the Graveyard, the Construction Site, the Urban and the Rural community. Each class performed their songs and dances.



More than 80 children and their parents celebrated Christmas at the graveyard. They were pleased with the message, lucky draw and gifts, songs and dances. Fong, the student of English class in Let Go 3, told that "I am excited and happy to perform the dance and the song. I received two gifts, burger and drink."



Matthew 1:23 "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). Mr. Choung, the village leader, appreciated the celebration that Bethel Mission did to help his people.

With the new ways of teachings, the project team can work in line with the government teachers and for the benefit to CDC as everyone will teach the Advanced Courses developed and supported by the Bluefield.



Arun, the Project Coordinator of IFL Project, joined the Basic Video Editing. The course helped the project team to take a good photos and videos for the reports including to use the Camera as a professional, the Introduction to Camera, Inside the Camera, Rules and Tips.

“I also learnt the goal how to take a photo are being short, with no repetition, State the problem/ issue clearly and simply, resonate with the target audience and leave a lasting impression. I also learned the clear meaning in the video shooting, ‘Let Your Photography and Videography Tell the Story!’ I learned how to do the Video Interview between two people by using many questions to ask about particular topic including the Preparation Stage before the interview, draft your questions (open question, simple and easy) and prepare the Consent Form, Knowing where the interview will take place (address, contact person), Prepare equipment and define role of the interviewer and camera person. It is a good skill. I learnt it and I shared what I learnt to the team in order to keep the project photo and video shooting more effectively and quality.
