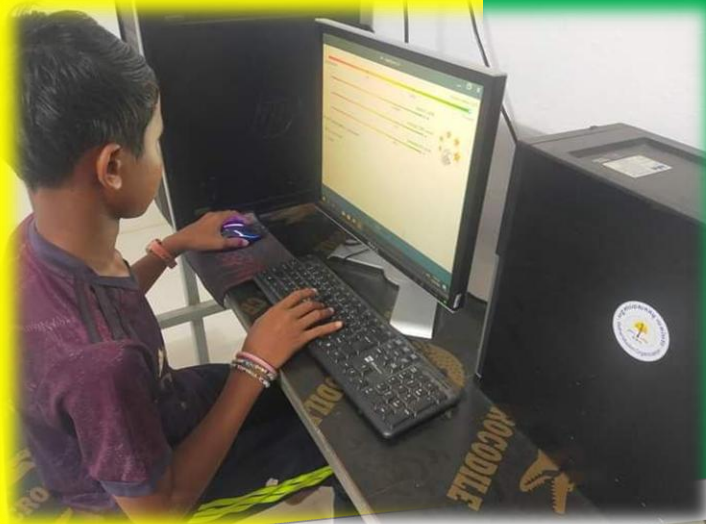


ANNUAL REPORT 2024



A Better Future For Every Child In Cambodia | Life In All Its Fullness | John 10:10

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Dear Supporting Partners,

Without your prayers, involvement and financial supports, we could not provide the great impacts to the lives of those living in the graveyard, the slum, the urban, the dump and the construction sites and the poor rural communities across Cambodia in 2024.

We would like to express my heartfelt thanks for your generous support. Your donation made the real impacts in the lives of those we served. Your kind and steady donation changed thousands of lives and we would invite you to celebrate. 3,051 high school students including 1,772 girls (58%) graduated their IT, Soft-Life Skills and Business Course within 11 high schools from 10 out of 25 provinces. Additionally, 352 children including 213 girls (61%) received their extracurricular classes of English, Chinese, Khmer Boost and Computer. The children also learned the values of lives through the Monthly Chapel and Sunday School.

We got the very strong involvement and support from the government in executing and implementing the works. The school management and the department of education appreciated Bethel Mission for the great contribution to the strategy of the government in promoting the Digitalization. The students were excited and satisfied with the programs.

It was the second year that Bethel Mission partnered with the People for Medical Cooperation International (PMCI) to provide the free medical check and treat to 514 patients, 356 women living in Preah Vihear at Bethel Mission School in order to spread the love of God in actions. Amongst the patients, the doctor team helped 217 general patients, 249 optical patients and 48 women passed the uterus cancer tested. Additionally, 4 older patients received crutches and 1 patient received patient trolley. The event was strongly support from the provincial administration, department of health and the relevant local authorities. The patients came from not only in the district, but other districts around the province.

In addition, Bethel Mission partnered with the Ministry of Interior, the General Department of Prisons and Provincial Prison to help the more than 70 prisoners with food pack including noodle and canned fish in Preah Vihear prison. The prisoners were excited to receive the gifts. As well, more than 80 children under five years old received the gift boxes to cherish their minds and soul.

Spiritually, more than 400 children and their families joined and celebrated Christmas and received gifts. Moreover, more than 500 students were preached about the gospel of salvation and majority accepted Jesus Christ as the Savior and Lord.

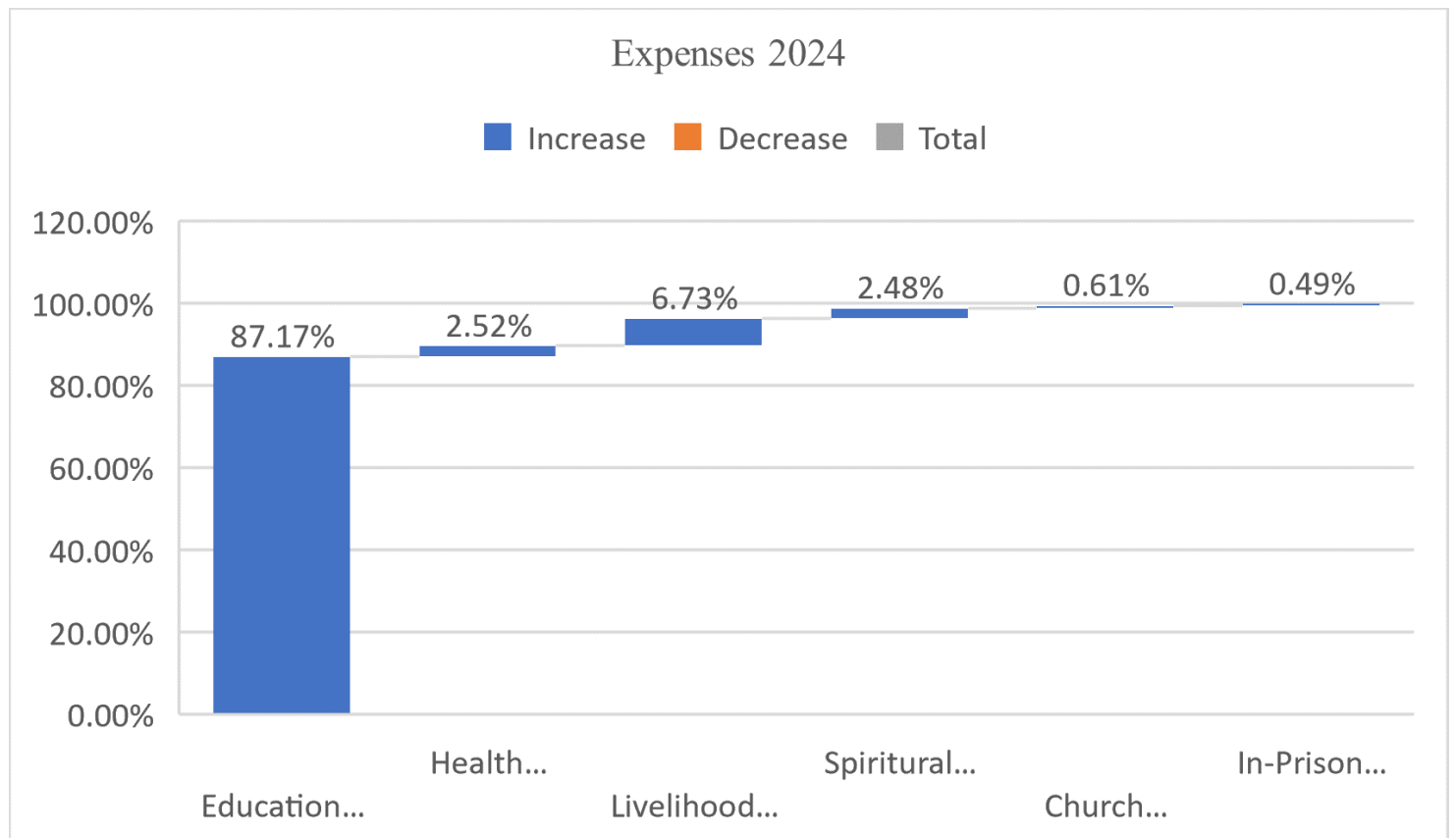

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OUR OBJECTIVES

1- Education

Proverbs 1:7 - The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge

There are different kinds of Education support in order to help transform the lives of the children and young youths within Bethel Mission.

1. **Ministry Education** is where a free Education Program offered to the children living in the graveyard, the slum, the dump and the construction site. It is the extracurricular study of Khmer, English and IT literacy classes to boost the children to learn beyond their government program. The children also received the extra school materials and supplies during their courses.



Graveyard Project: More than 70 students coming to study daily at the graveyard mercy project.

Chantey, girl, 7 years old, is one of the children whose parents were born and live illegally in the graveyard. I'm very happy to have the chance to share my story with you today. I live in graveyard with my parents and grandmother. It was my first opportunity to start preschool in 2023 supported by Bethel Mission. It was hard for me to start studying at the first. I could not even draw the lines and read the Khmer alphabets and numbers. However, beyond studying in the class with my teacher, I got help from my grandmother. I am one of the top students in class. My family and friends were so proud of me. I got a good discipline from my family and teacher that I had to review the lesson and read the books before I could access to the phone for fun. I shared and taught what I learned from my teacher to my friends and siblings. I am happy with my great results from my study. I am able to write and read. I do not only learn Khmer, but also English. I can sign both.



The students also received the regular support of the school materials and supplies for their study as well. Theara, the girl, said "Coming to study at Bethel Mission I got some more gift beyond what I expected."

Dump Sit Project: There are more than 1,000 people working hard both day and night to earn a living from the dump site where it is very jeopardizing to their health both day and night on the rubbish mountain. They gather to live in different groups around and close to the dump site where housing and electricity are expensive comparing to their daily income from the daily work.



Sokha, one of the caregivers of the children told that "The people take risks every day. Sometimes, they are run over by the truck and cut by the sharp items on the dump mount and no one take care because they are not allowed to get in the place, but we do not have any choice to survive our lives. Everyone gets wounded every day." She added that it was harder to collect, search and earn a living as the dump truck team did the first search before they arrived at the dump mount. The debt of rental, utilities and eating are increased owing to the less daily income.



On the other hands, the children are not well enrolled in school because they do not have a permanent address and birth certificate locally and some children have to go with their parents at the dump mount because no one at the rental home. Bethel Mission was called to bring the loves of God our Lord Jesus Christ in His actions in July 2024 to launch the mercy project with one group of more than 40 families. The Education program was started where more than 20 children enrolled. The children started learning Khmer alphabets, numbers and some English with their local teacher from Monday to Friday. The children also received the school materials and supplies for their study.

Afar view of the dump site mount:





Construction Site Project: From 2023, there were more than 100 families coming from different provinces to live and work as the construction workers along with their families, especially the children in one place and Bethel Mission provided the good support of Education program to the children. However, the company needed the land where they lived to expand their construction work and they dismissed the families the separate and different location where no water sources was accessible. The families had to collect water afar from where they live with their individual water containers and transportation.

The construction work became less and less because of less buyers. The majority of the buildings are standing still everywhere across the country. Some families migrated to the different companies, back home or seeking for work at the neighboring countries.



In order to continue and support the children with their Education, Bethel Mission built the mobile tents and placed into the two different locations so that both the volunteer teacher and the children were able to come to teach and learn. There were 17 children joining their class of Khmer and English and they additional received the school materials and supplies from the project.

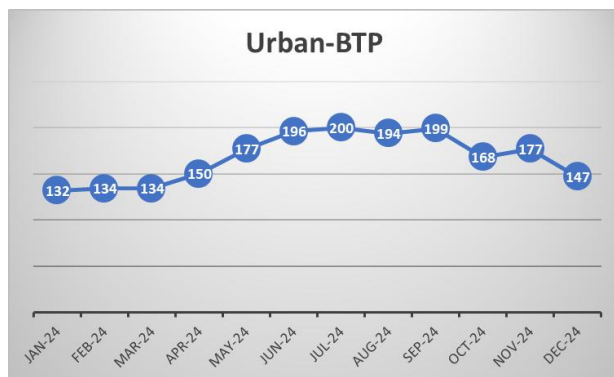
Slum Project: Bethel Mission phased in and support the slum community of more than 60 families in 2018. However, the growth of the children and the wellbeing of the community were dramatically changed and the project was phased out in August 2024. Over the past 6 years, the lives of the children and families were improved physically and spiritually.



2. **Business Education** is designed to run a self-sufficient project for Bethel Mission. There are two different project locations, in Phnom Penh, Preah Vihear and Takeo. The tuition fees paying from the children are good for the volunteer teachers to get their allowance for their teaching times. Bethel Mission needs to raise funds for the rental for Phnom Penh and Preah Vihear, for Takeo is run at the local church where 70% of the net profit was deducted of the cooperate.



Phnom Penh: The Education project is run at Bethel Mission office for the urban community where the poor families sent their children to study Chinese, English, Khmer and IT literacy. There are 8 teachers.



The students pay their tuition between \$8-10 per month to learn their evening extracurricular classes. With the fees paying, they were able to access to a free IT class once a week. They also receive the school materials and supplies. My name is **Sreyneas**. I am 15 years old. I have two sisters. One day I went to BETHEL School because I heard from my friend. When I first joined at BETHEL school, I thought that

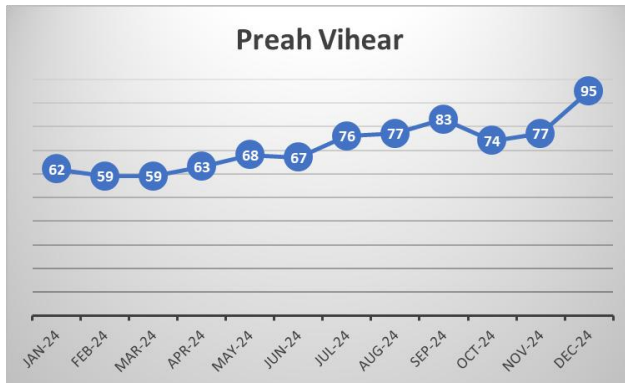
it was very difficult for me to study but what I think was not right because I have met good teachers and they're very friendly. At BETHEL School, I received some good moral teachings to education the students and to let them know what is good to do and what is bad. The students at BETHEL also help each other and friendly. There are also foreign teachers visiting and teaching sometime. I like my teacher because he explains me clearly about what I have don't understand. He graduated from ACE and he is good at IT. I love IT literacy even it is scheduled once a week it is important for me. Thanks.



The project starts at 4 pm to 7:30 pm from Monday to Friday except the national holiday and the meeting.



Preah Vihear: It borders Lao, more than 300 km away, at the northern part of the country where not many NGOs and charities dared to work. It takes more than 5 hours to drive. Bethel Mission has rented the



buildings with 6 rooms to run the Education program since 2022 for lower tuition fees in order to help the students to improve their English and IT literacy. Blessedly, the statistics of the students grew gradually from month to months according to the graph. The students are able to pay \$9 per month for their English and IT literacy and they sometimes received extra school materials and supplies to

their study. The preschool with 3 hours per day pays \$15 per month. The fees paying is much lower comparing to the local private schools within the region. The 3 teachers and one admin staff to be responsible for the functioning of the school. The students are happy to come and study here. The key issues for the project is the rental fees where the additional support beyond the program is needed.



Takeo: In order to support the local church to generate income and support their mission, Bethel Mission cooperated and started the Education program with the tuition fees paying. The program does not only help the church, but the local people to teach and share the profit back with the program.



The project launched in July 2024 and up to the end of December 2024, there were more than 80 students enrolling to their extracurricular of English and Preschool. It was the good financial balance after the start where the increased profit kept rising up for the church.

The students, as well, received some additional school materials and supplies from the Bethel Mission. They are

happy to come and learn and share their knowledge and good moral with one another.



3. High School Education

Digitalization is one of the priorities for the Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) in the “Pentagonal Strategy”. Within the same time, the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport is implementing the Education Strategic Plan (ESP) 2024-2028, a blueprint to transform the country’s educational landscape with an ambitious focus on inclusivity, quality and innovation driven by phase one of the seventh-mandate government’s “Pentagonal Strategy” and the Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG4) on education, outlines broad-reaching reforms designed to elevate the education sector's role in achieving Cambodia’s long-term socio-economic goals. “This plan will guide organizations at all levels, including education institutions, towards high performance with responsibility and accountability,” **Hang Chuon Naron**, Minister of Education, Youth, and Sports (MoEYS) added.



MoEYS is working hard to officially launch the digital education program to promote ICT and digital literacy in the multiple levels including primary, lower secondary, and upper secondary by aiming to provide children with the necessary knowledge, skills, and attitudes that allow them to grow safely and fulfill adequate competencies in digital environments. The ministry also plans to further integrate digital skills training into non-formal education, providing digital content and online learning opportunities.



Even RGC and MoEYS are pushing and increasing their annual budget to focus on Education, especially the Digitalization campaign nationwide, but the limited resources are seen, especially in the provinces at the remote districts are in great needs for the computer labs. With the great contribution, Bethel Mission under the financial support from the Foundation Investment For Life (IFL), Netherland, is helping 12 high schools in responding to the gaps of RGC and MoEY up to the end of December 2024 including one high school in the capital of Phnom Penh.



Mr. Hak Try, the Director of the Office of Education representing the **Mr. Yi Songki**, the Director of the Office of Education, Battambang province, said in the opening of the first computer lab on December 21, 2024 that “It is not far from the city centre, however, we are not able to have a computer lab for the school, Kdoldontev high school since the start in 2010. We are grateful to get supported today so that hundreds of the students are able to learn IT because this will be difficult for them to university if they do not know and use the computer as their basic knowledge and skill. It is the most important for everyone to study the computer as it is the Digital Era. I would like to thank Bethel Mission and the Donor for the kind donation and support to our school.”



Ms. Nita, girl, the former student at school#5, Borivas high school, Kampot province and the first-year student in her university studying in Phnom Penh, spoke at the opening of school#12, Kdoldontev high school, Battambang province that “My school is one of the 12 high schools got supported by Bethel Mission and IFL as well. I enrolled and graduated the IT, Soft-Life Skill and Business Course. It made me easy to learn at the university because I have IT basic knowledge and skills. I would like to appeal for the additional support from Bethel Mission and IFL project to more schools in Cambodia so that more youths are able to pursue their IT literacy, Soft-Life Skill and Business Course because it is very important for everyone to acquire the skills for their higher education and a job opportunity in the future.



Bethel Mission and IFL project worked closely with the 11 high schools and graduated 3,051 students including 1,772 girls (58%) from their IT literacy, Soft-Life Skills and Business Course.

Every student was very excited and happy to receive their certificates with pride of themselves and the

helps from the project. **Mr. Vannak**, Deputy Director of school#12, Kdoldonteav, Battambang province, said “I commit to take a good advantage of Computer Lab for my teachers that lack of this skill as well.”

Ni Sa, in grade 12, the left picture with the gift box from school#8, Tbeng high school, Kampong Thom province, told that “I understood that it was not easy to learn computer at the first start, but it kept on moving because I know that IT is very important to me and everyone at

the moment. I learnt Typing and MS Word. I am very happy to receive my first certificate. Even it is a basic skill for me, but I am proud of myself to see my result.

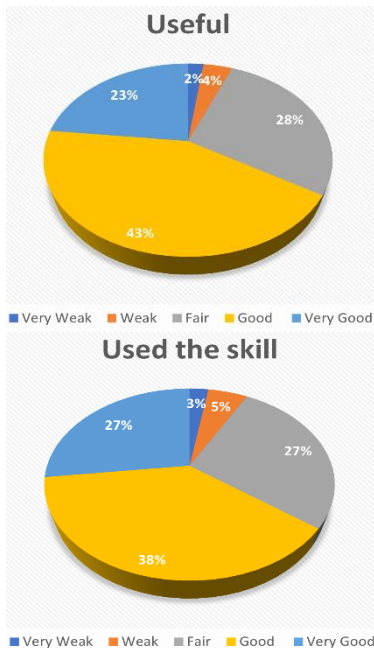
She appreciated that “I would like to thank to my teacher, the principal and Bethel Mission who helped me and my friends to not only IT, but also Soft-Life Skills and Business Course. I do hope I will use my skill and certificate to show to my parents and friends so that they will try to learn more. It will be very difficult to apply for a job without IT skill. I hope the project will continue to support my school. Best wishes.”



This is the results from the last 6 months of 2024:

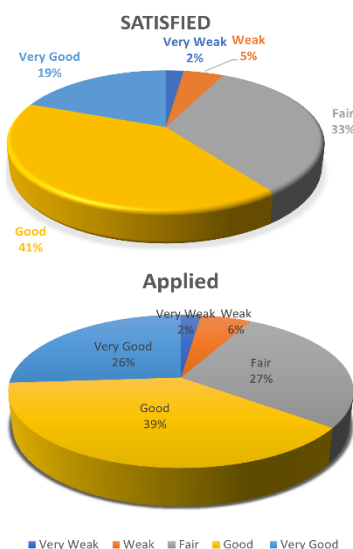

The project conducted the surveys and 2,009 responses were received. The survey pie-chart shown that 90% of the students confirmed that the training met their expectation except 10% of them who came to student irregularly and always absent.

The students enjoyed to start with typing games and this helped them to make their typing speed better. They could see by themselves with their typing accuracy and words per minute they typed. The greatest challenges and great time were at MS Word, MS Excell and Power Point. The students learned that their struggling made them a good result, certification at the Graduation Day.

Sonita, 15 years old, grade 11, the student at school#5, Borivas High School, Kampot province, told that: I am very proud to get the top 5 award for my computer class among other 193 students. I would love to thank my teacher for helping me to learn the skill and Bethel Mission and IFL project for your kind donation to our school with the computer lab so that my friends and I were able to experience the skills. I do hope the skill will help me when study at the university.



According to the surveys with the students after each final exam, the project found that 93% told that they were satisfied with the skill and 92% of them committed to apply their knowledge and skills to their higher education and employment.

Nita, 17, grade 12, school#9, Krang Sramor High School, Kampong Chhnang, said that “I am very excited to receive the computer skill certificate. It is the first time since school began. I am very happy. I would like to thank Bethel Mission and IFL project for having the computer lab for my high school so that everyone at grade 10-12 are able to study. I found that IT knowledge could connect us to the new world of digitalization because we cannot live and work without it. I do hope I can use the knowledge and skills I learnt to my university.



2- Health Intervention

2.1 Health Care And Treatment

On 8-9 May 2024, Bethel Mission partnered with PMCI Cambodia to provide the free medical check and treat to 514 patients, 356 women living in Preah Vihear at Bethel Mission School in order to spread the love of God in actions.



Amongst the doctor team helped 217 general patients, 249 optical patients and 48 women passed the uterus cancer tested. Additionally, 4 older patients received crutches and 1 patient received patient trolley.



2.2 Ear, Nose and Throat Check and Treatment

Hundreds of the children and their families from graveyard, the slum and poor rural communities came and had their Ear, Nose and Throat checked and treated free by the doctor team from Korea and Khmer joined together and helped. Hearing is important, but most people did not focus and had a regular care.



According to the check, many people got the problems with their ears where cleaning had never done. Those who got the serious case were received the medicines and continued to have the treatment.



2.3 Emergency Relief for Food Shortages



With the financial support from DE HEUS TMH CO.,LTD, Bethel Mission provided the food packs to 127 families living in the graveyard. The Distribution Event was made on January 26, 2024 and chaired by Mrs. Touch, the Director of the office of Office of Social Affairs and Social Welfare Khan Chba Ampov and the representative of the Khan governor along with 3 delegates and the representatives from the commune and village offices and DE HEUS TMH CO., LTD.



Everyone was excited and happy to receive the food packs. The food pack is very helpful to respond to the real need of the 127 families living with food shortage as listed by the community and village leaders to alleviate their burden and starvation. This will also be an additional nutrition to the wellbeing of the children.



Mrs. Touch, the representative to Khan governor, appreciated the kind donation from Bethel Mission and said "I would like to give my thanks on behalf of the community people and the governor to Bethel Mission and the donor who generously helped. I do hope that Bethel Mission will continue to support even the food pack does not last long, but it is very helpful for these people in their time of need." Mrs. Dany and Channy, the widows living the graveyard told that "We are pleased to receive the food pack from Bethel Mission. It helps our families to live for a month or so." Each family received Soap, Krama/Scarf, Noodle, Fish sauce, Sugar, MSG, Cooking Oil, Salt and Soy Sauce.



With the support from Harvest Mission International Cambodia, 35 families living the graveyard, the dump and the construction sites received 25 kg per family to relieve their food shortage after the recovery from the pandemics.



Mrs. Mom said during the distribution at the dump site that “What we need is rice to survive our family because the work on the dump mounts are more difficult to earn a living due to many people are competing to search at the same place, more than 1000 people are doing this job because of no choices.”



In partnership with the local church, the rice pack was fed to hundred of families including those living in the graveyard, the slum and poor rural communities.



More than 400 children including Muslim ones received the hygiene materials (toothpaste, toothbrush, soap and scarf) and nutrition food and milk to improve their growth. Mr. Sok, the Muslim, imam said “I am very happy and excited to see the Christian people come and help my people with regardless of religion. I do not mind whether the gospels were shared to them as I am the imam, I cannot convert them because they have their own freedom to choose what is best for their lives.”



2.4 Clothes Distribution

The clothes were collected from individuals in every household who needed to donate what they did not use or need. It has been more than 20 years that this project was initiated before the foundation of Bethel Mission. The clothes had been sent and distributed to those living in the graveyard, the slum and poor rural communities across the country, especially to the local churches for their outreach activities.



3- Livelihood And Income Generation Support

Bethel Mission initiates to endeavor for its long-term sustainability to the beneficiaries, local churches, and the organization where the international donation becoming smaller and smaller.

3.1 Cow Bank: The family or church partner will get one or two good adult cows and after the cow produced a calf and weaning time approached, the calf will be shared one each or turn shift. If the cow(s) is not productive or death, it must be sold to buy the replacement or share the cash of 60% for the family or church partner and BMO get 40%. This is from one local church partner in Siem Reap province.



3.2 Water Bottle Production:

With the gift from UK Donor EJP, Bethel Mission started the Water Bottle Production Project in order to sale the bottled drinking water and income will return to support the work of Bethel Mission. The Water Bottle Production machine and system were well installed and test at the 2 different laboratories including RDI of Resource Laboratory and the Laboratory of Institut Pasteur du Cambodge.



3.3 Mobile App Payment:



Bethel Mission signed the Agreement with Sathapana Bank to have some finance transaction and the Mobile App Payment so that everyone can pay and support. We regularly receive a few donation since the start of this partnership agreement. *“Small acts of kindness can create big changes! 4- Spiritual Nurture And Formation

The Vision of Bethel Mission is to see the people’s lives Transformed and Values of the Transformation is inside out. It must be started with Jesus. **Mr. Sirivuth**, the Founder and CEO, said “When Heart transformed, Live changed” as a confirmation to the book of Proverbs 4:23, “Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it.” Nothing is better to give than to inject Jesus Christ into their lives. That is why preaching the gospels of salvation and discipleship making are vitally prioritized within the work of Bethel Mission. **Mr. Sirivuth** confirmed to the groups of the donors and the annual graduation that “To change the lives, we need to help them both physically (Education, clean water, hygiene, sanitation and food) and spiritually (Faith in Jesus, Repentance, Worship, Prayer, Bible study and Witnessing about Jesus).”



4.1 International Children’s Day

It is a great day to remember the children what Jesus said in the book of Matthew 19:14 “Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.”



4.2 Easter

Even it is not the holiday for Cambodia, but Bethel Mission is to celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead after he was crucified. It is the reminder that "to Love is to Forgive and Sacrifice." The people should live and love one another and forgive each other according to teachings of the Lord Jesus Christ. "And walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." Ephesians 5:2



At the graveyard community, both the children and their caregivers came to celebrate the Resurrection Day or Easter by worshiping, praying and enjoying with the scripture. Mrs. Channy, one of the women said "I will not turn back even my mother and children do not agree with my faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. I always pray and ask for help in all my circumstances in lives. I know Jesus loves me and died for me."



4.3 Christmas

Christmas was celebrated beyond an annual festival, but to commemorate the birth of Jesus Christ to come and save the world from sin as written in the book John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." According to the scripture, the man will die and perish in hell if s/he is not saved by the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. The birth of Jesus separated the world history into two different parts, AD stands for Anno Domini, which is Latin for in the year of the Lord. It's a way of counting years based on the estimated birth of Jesus Christ. BC stands for Before Christ, and it's a way of counting years before the estimated birth of Jesus Christ. Everyone uses the year of the Lord whether they are non-Christians.



4.4 Monthly Chapel

It has been initiated in order to preach the gospels of salvation to the children coming to their English, Khmer, Chinese and Computer classes at the graveyard, the dump and construction sites, the urban and the rural communities. There were more than 400 children impacted from the initiative.



The children are able to worship the Lord Jesus Christ and learn Bible together through the preaching of the national and international preachers. In the meantime, hundreds of Holy Bibles and the evangelism materials were distributed.



Both parents and the students experienced their heart changed after they joined the chapel service. **Mrs. Theary**, the caregiver, said “My son did not only learn his English and Computer, but his behavior also changed. His study is better than he was outside Bethel Mission.”



4.5 Saturday and Sunday School

According to Exodus 20:8 “Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.” It is open to every student.



Bethel Mission opens Saturday two services for the children and the caregivers at the dump site and Sunday services are for those in the graveyard, the urban and rural communities where they freely and voluntarily come to worship God our Lord Jesus Christ and learn His teachings of the Sins and Results, Loves and Forgiveness.



At Saturday and Sunday School, the children and the caregivers learned about the quality of life, love, hope and forgiveness beyond the eternity. Chantey, the girl at the graveyard told “I join Sunday School with my friends and siblings to sing worship songs, dances and learn the Bible about Jesus. Teacher Sinuon teaches me and my friends to love and help each other.”



Dara, the student at the urban project, joined Sunday School and told “I do not only sing the worship songs and learn the discipleship class, but I also received the values of life and nutrition food after.”



4.6 Outreach Events

Beyond the targeted locations, Bethel Mission also went to do the outreach events outside in order to preach the gospels and conduct Bible study among the children and their caregivers. It was in high school.



Outreach in missionary partnership at Kampong Cham, Harvest Mission International Cambodia where nearly 1,000 students coming to their general knowledge of kindergarten, primary, secondary and high schools. The goal is to teach and preach the gospels of the God our Lord Jesus Christ and make the disciples across the nations



In partnership with local church partners, Bethel Mission reached out to the children and their caregivers in the Muslim Community to support the school materials and supplies and nutrition food.



5- Local Church Engagement

The ultimate goal is to equip local church pastors and leaders to have a self-sufficient resource so that the church become a place where hurting people to find healing and receive social and spiritual support.



Beyond equipping, Bethel Mission involved and supported the local churches including education and health program assistance in order to promote the participation from the local people to the churches.



As well, Bethel Mission supported the local church partners with husbandry including cow bank to improve the economy in doing the ministry. It is expected that the cows will produce more calves and the church will share with Bethel Mission and their congregation.



6- In Prison Project

With the international support, Bethel Mission worked with the ministry of interior-the general department of prisons to bring gift boxes more than 80 children with parents and provided food pack to more than 70 prisoners in Christmas.

Fun and Assignment: The children are happy with their preschool class and they focus on their study and assignment. They like coloring and drawing. They received their materials and supplies once every 3 months to support their study.



The majority of preschool and the community children come to their Sunday School separately from their caregivers to worship the Lord and Bible study. The children like watching Jesus' film and they much concentrate.

The project work very close with the DoE for the school#12 assessment in Battambang province where five schools were visited.

Mr. Lim, the Deputy Director of the Department of Education, said “I would appreciate for the close connection and cooperation with DoE in order to set up and install a computer lab in my province. We strongly

welcome and support the agreement so that the school students are able to require the knowledge of IT. NGO is playing an important role to fill the gap of the government, especially the resource assistance.”

Mr. Sophat, the governor of Phnom Kravanh District, Pursat Province, presided over the graduation ceremony at the school#11, Bakchenchien High School, said to the students that “You have the opportunity to learn computers. Please study hard and be good at it. If someone does not know computers, s/he will find it difficult to do any kind of work in this generation. It is very different from my generation. I had never even touched a computer, just look at it because they said the virus will affect it.”



The project would appreciate for the active participation, involvement and strong support from the Department of Education (DoE), the Office of Education (OoE), School Management Committee (SMC), the school principals and teachers for making the plans well accomplished by graduating the students once every 6 months.



Mr. Channy, the governor of Samaki Meanchey District in Kampong Chhnang Province, addressed in the graduation of school#9, Krang Sramor High School that “Knowledge is really important for everyone, especially the technology which we cannot live without it. The job market is competitive if you cannot use the computer to work, you are finding life difficult by yourself.

You are lucky to have Bethel Mission and IFL project to come and give you beyond IT literacy, but also Soft-Life skills and Business Course. The skills are very essential for you to pursue. I do hope that the project will continue to help and expend in my district as there are a few more high school needing the computer labs. Thank You.”

Mr. Chheng, the chairman of the school management committee for school#4, Sampov Poun, said during the graduation that “I did not have and learn computer at my age. We struggled to survive from the genocidal regime. There was no education. As the students of this generation, you are very lucky, especially Bethel Mission and IFL project partnered with our school and support the computer lab.
